Applying for admission

1. Application and fee: Complete the application form and send it to the Office of Admissions with a \$50 (U.S. dollars) nonrefundable fee.

2. Educational credentials: Submit official transcripts for all secondary or high schools, colleges, and universities you have attended. Official transcripts are issued directly by your school, college, or university and must bear the official stamp or seal of the institution as well as the signature of the appropriate official. Transcripts that are not in English must include a certified translation. Transcripts will not be accepted by fax or electronic mail.

If your institution or country issues only one original transcript, contact the Office of Admissions *before* submitting your transcript to prevent your original from being destroyed.

You may receive college credit for Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate (IB), General Certificate of Secondary Education (GCSE) A Level or other advanced level examinations. Official results must be submitted to receive credit.

3. English language proficiency: If your native language is not English, you must submit official exam results from the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) tests. The University of Oregon’s institutional TOEFL code is 4846.

4. SAT and ACT scores: Not required for international students.

5. Personal statement and letters of recommendation (optional): If your academic performance was affected by special circumstances, you may submit a personal statement and explanation.

Housing

Undergraduate applicants automatically receive residence hall information. You can also visit the housing website at housing.uoregon.edu.

Postbaccalaureate applicants

In addition to the documents listed above, you must submit a statement of purpose—a one-page explanation of the reasons you want to pursue a second bachelor’s degree. This completed application and supporting documents must be submitted no fewer than 30 days before the beginning of the term in which you are applying for admission. Conditional admission

If you meet all university requirements except for the English Language Proficiency requirement, you will be conditionally admitted to the university and must enroll in the American English Institute (AEI) aei.uoregon.edu. You can be admitted to university courses upon successful completion of AEI or achieving a passing TOEFL or IELTS score.

Immigration

Information provided on this application must match your passport. To prepare your immigration documents, U.S. immigration regulations require documentation of financial support for you and your dependents who will accompany you to the United States. Financial documents must be dated within six months of applying and can include bank statements, certificates of balance, sponsor letters, certificate of deposits, or scholarship letters. Please mail or fax your financial documents as soon as possible.

Admission deferral

Applications are processed for the term specified on your application. To apply for a different term, you must submit a new application and updated transcripts. The \$50 application fee is good for one academic year (September through July).
